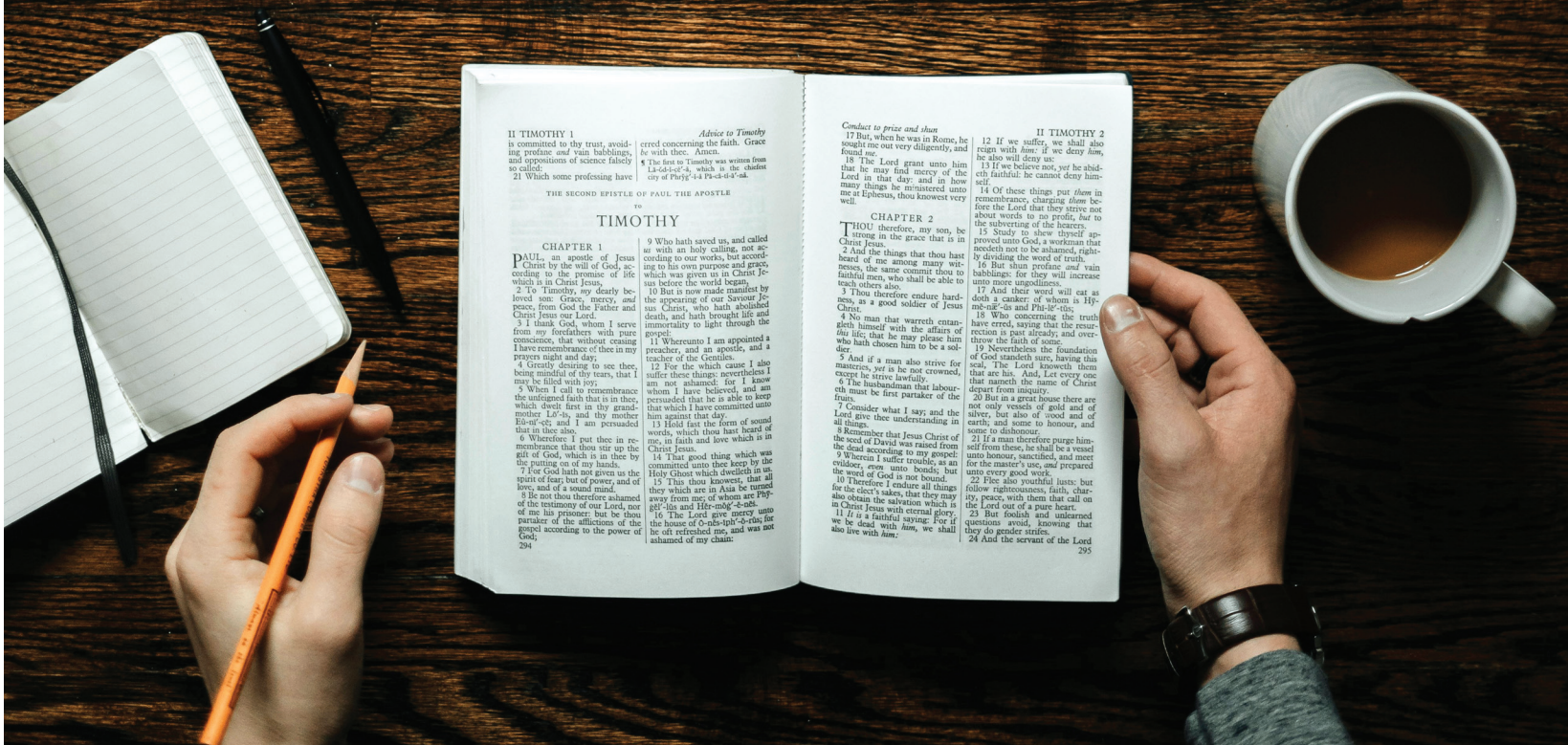

THE SECOND EPISTLE OF PAUL THE APOSTLE TO TIMOTHY

TIMOTHY

CHAPTER 1
PAUL, an apostle of Jesus Christ by the will of God, according to the promise of life which is in Christ Jesus:
2 To Timothy, my dearly beloved son: Grace, mercy, and peace, from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.
3 I thank God, whom I serve from my foreshiners with pure conscience, that without ceasing I have remembrance of thee in my prayers night and day.
4 Greatly desiring to see thee, being mindful of thy tears, that I may be filled with joy.
5 When I call to remembrance the unfeigned faith that is in thee, which dwelt first in thy grandmother Lois, and thy mother Eunice; and I am persuaded that in thee also.
6 Wherefore I put thee in remembrance that thou stir up the gift of God, which is in thee by the putting on of my hands.
7 For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of a sound mind.
8 Be not thou therefore ashamed of my testimony of our Lord, nor of me his prisoner: but be thou partaker of the afflictions of the gospel according to the power of God.
9 Who hath saved us, and called us with an holy calling, not according to our works, but according to his own purpose and grace, which was given us in Christ Jesus before the world began.
10 But is now made manifest by the appearing of our Saviour Jesus Christ, who hath abolished death, and hath brought life and immortality to light through the gospel:
11 Whereunto I am appointed a preacher, and an apostle, and a teacher of the Gentiles.
12 For the which cause I also am not ashamed: for I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that he is able to keep that which I have committed unto him against that day.
13 Hold fast the form of sound words, which thou hast heard of me, in faith and love which is in Christ Jesus.
14 That good thing which was committed unto thee keep by the Holy Ghost which dwelleth in us.
15 This thou knowest, that all they which are in Asia are departed from me, of whom are Phileas and Hieronymus:
16 The Lord give mercy unto thee, that thou mayest find mercy of the house of Onesiphorus; for he oft refreshed me, and was not ashamed of my chain:
17 But, when he was in Rome, he sought me out very diligently, and found me:
18 The Lord grant unto him that he may find mercy of the Lord in that day: and in how many things he ministered unto me at Ephesus, thou knowest very well.

CHAPTER 2

THOU therefore, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus.
2 And the things that thou hast heard of me among many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also.
3 Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ.
4 No man that warreth entangleth himself with the affairs of this life; that he may please him who hath chosen him to be a soldier.
5 And if a man also strive for mastery, yet is he not crowned, except he strive lawfully.
6 The husbandman that laboureth must be first partaker of the fruit.
7 Consider what I say; and the Lord give thee understanding in all things.
8 Remember that Jesus Christ of the seed of David was raised from the dead according to my gospel.
9 Wherein I suffer trouble, as an outsider, even unto bonds; but the word of God is not bound.
10 Therefore I endure all things for the elect's sakes, that they may also obtain the salvation which is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory.
11 It is a faithful saying, For if we be dead with him, we shall also live with him:
12 If we suffer, he shall also suffer with us: if we deny him, he also will deny us:
13 If we believe not, yet he abideth faithful: he cannot deny himself.
14 Of these things put thou in remembrance, charging them before the subverting of the hearers.
15 Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.
16 But shun profane and vain babblings; for they will increase unto more ungodliness.
17 And their word will eat as doth a canker of whom is Hypocritis and Phylisites.
18 Who concerning the truth have erred, saying that the resurrection is past already; and overthrow the faith of some.
19 Nevertheless the foundation of God standeth sure, having this seal, The Lord knoweth them that are his. And, Let every one that nameth the name of Christ depart from iniquity.
20 But in a great house there are not only vessels of gold and of silver, but also of wood and of earth; and some to honour, and some to dishonour.
21 If a man therefore purge himself from these, he shall be a vessel unto honour, sanctified, and meet for the master's use, and prepared unto every good work.
22 Flee also youthful lusts: but follow righteousness, faith, charity, peace, with them that call on the Lord out of a pure heart.
23 But foolish and unlearned questions avoid, knowing that they do gender strifes.

I recently had the opportunity to sit in a room for two days with the heads of our National Departments and many of the State Executive Directors of our denomination. As I sat there listening to reports from each of the State and National Departments, a few observations struck me, and I wanted to share them with you.

For years, I have heard about all the differences within our denomination. You know things like east versus west of the Mississippi, KJV only versus all the other translations, Welch versus Southeast versus Randall, formal worship versus contemporary, co-op versus not co-op, suit, tie and dresses only versus casual, Amillennialism versus

Dispensationalism versus you know the other two, Sunday night service versus no Sunday night service, Sunday school versus small groups, the list could go on and on.

Like in much of Christianity, we tend to define ourselves and then divide based on what is different and what we are against. Yet, as I sat listening to these leaders, I was not struck by our differences, nor did I hear them complaining about what they were against. Instead, I was struck by all the things we shared in common.

I observed men of God with a sincere and passionate love for God. Men with a real love of people and heartfelt concern for each other. Men with a genuine desire for the well-being of the churches and pastors they represented and for all the churches of the other states as well. It was my first time to be with each of these men, and every one of them greeted me with kindness and respect. These were men with tears for the heartaches of others. Men who laughed and shared a sense

of humor. These men have faced real difficulties in their personal and family lives. I felt no animosity or division at any point in the meetings.

As I thought back over the time I spent with these men and fellow pastors and church members, it became clear that we do have far more in common than I have ever imagined. I have discovered that our similarities are of much greater value than our differences. As I focus on them, I can practice the words of the apostle Paul, "Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things." (Philippians 4:8 ESV)

The greatest truth is that you are the same kind of different as me... men and women delivered from our sin by God's grace and mercy, who can only boast of what the Lord has done for us.
